

Life Thoughts

The <u>Dallas Morning News</u> ran this opinion piece by Amy O'Donnell, **Texas** Alliance for Life's Communications Director, on Wednesday, March 16, 2023.

This is a response to the incorrect claims that the Texas pro-life laws that protect unborn babies from abortion, particularly the Human Life Protection Act, are preventing doctors from providing abortions in rare cases necessary to save the mother's life. This is not the truth about the Texas laws.



Recently, the Center for Reproductive Rights, a New York-based abortion advocacy firm, filed a lawsuit asking a Texas state court to clarify the exceptions in Texas abortion laws regarding pregnant women with certain rare, but life-threatening medical conditions. The case, filed on behalf of five Texas women and two physicians, is *Zurawski vs. Texas*.

When Amanda Zurawski was in her 18th week of pregnancy, *well before viability*, she suffered from a rare but severe condition known as preterm premature rupture of membranes, or PPROM. In other words, her water broke. There was little chance her baby could survive and without intervention, Zurawski's life was in danger from infection. Six different doctors interviewed for this report said the *standard of care is to induce labor with the intent to save the mother's life, knowing that, sadly, the unborn child would not survive.* All six confirmed this is permitted under Texas law. Unfortunately, Ms. Zurawski's doctor waited until she had developed sepsis before providing the appropriate treatment. She lost her baby, and she almost lost her own life, *but that had nothing to do with Texas laws.*

In August 2022, the Texas Human Life Protection Act went into effect which *protects unborn babies from abortion beginning at conception.* That law *specifically allows* a physician to perform an abortion when "in the exercise of reasonable medical judgment, the pregnant female . . . has a life-threatening physical condition aggravated by, caused by, or arising from a pregnancy that places the female at risk of death or poses a serious risk of substantial impairment of a major bodily function unless the abortion is performed or induced." Nothing requires a woman's death to be imminent or her unborn baby's heart to stop beating before the baby is removed. The heartbreaking tragedy of aborting a baby to save the mother's life need not endanger the mother's life as well.

Since the Human Life Protection Act went into effect, *elective abortions in Texas have dropped from thousands per month to zero,* according to the Texas Department of Health and Human Services Induced Termination of Pregnancy reports. At the same time, doctors have performed a relatively small number of abortions monthly for "emergency and health" reasons, without any negative consequences for doctors.

Sadly, misunderstanding among some well-intentioned, but poorly informed, Texas doctors is leading to unnecessary and dangerous delays which threaten women's lives. Texas Alliance for Life *supports clarification of the medical emergency exception language* as well as the *education of Texas doctors* to address that confusion and misinformation. Doctors are routinely educated about other legislation affecting their practice in Texas via the hospitals they serve and the state agency that regulates doctors. We hope that, with this clarification, women across Texas will receive the standard of care they need and deserve during such a difficult time.

How Deep the Father's Love for You and...

On Sunday, February 26 at 3:28 p.m. I got the kind of phone call that every parent dreads. My youngest son was calling... for a second time. I was in Zoom meeting and had ignored his first call. In our family, we have a code: if the first call goes unanswered and it is an emergency, call back a second time.

"Dad, I'm pretty sure my car is totaled. I'm really sorry." My heart stopped. "Are you okay?" I asked. He replied, "I'm okay, but I'm pretty sure the car is totaled!" I responded, "I don't even care about that right now, as long as you are okay!" He later was able to describe what happened, that another car lost control around a curve and came into his lane and collided with him head-on.

Oh, how it could have been so much more tragic! I *really* love cars, and I loved my son's car, but I would much rather mourn a car than my son! Even though he faces lingering challenges of whiplash and the hassles of replacing his car, the main thing is that he was alive...and he was loved and cared for by his mother and father!

My wife and I are far from perfect parents. If you don't believe me, just ask our college-age sons! Despite our imperfections, we deeply love both boys and would gladly suffer in their place rather than to see them suffer or struggle. But sometimes in life we cannot take away the pain of their trouble. And in our sin, sometimes our expressions of love, care, and concern are not perfect.

This brings to mind what Jesus taught about our Heavenly Father's love in Matthew 7: "Who among you, if his son asks him for bread, will give him a stone? Or if he asks for a fish, will give him a snake? If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give good things to those who ask him."

In Christ Jesus we are adopted children of the Heavenly Father whose love is perfect and knows no bounds. He weeps when we weep, laughs when we laugh, suffers when we suffer, and rejoices when we rejoice. Why? Because he loves us perfectly as sons and daughters. This is Good News! And this Good News is for us! And this Good News is for the world, too! Jesus was not only sent as a gift to the righteous, but as a gift to the world, even those who do not know it.

Whether my son knows how much we love him I do not know. His recognition of our love does not change the depth of it! But for our son to receive the full benefit of our love, it is incumbent upon him to receive the gift of our love and engage in an active relationship (which is not natural for teenagers)! This helps me understand God's love for you, me, and all people. God loves us so perfectly and deeply that it is beyond our understanding. But it is only in relationship that we experience the fullness of his love and grace.

So, we have a calling to share this Good News with others. Not only do we delight in the goodness of being children of the Heavenly Father, we long for friends, family, neighbors, strangers, and even enemies to experience it too! As Paul testifies in Romans 5:8, *God proves his own love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.*
