

We have begun our adventure together as people and pastor, brothers and sisters in our Lord Jesus Christ! Again, I thank you for the privilege of serving together. Tanya and I both enjoy very much all of the connections we are making in this great family of faith.

Liturgy

You have probably noticed the small tweaks that have been made in our liturgy. Some of them have been to help the flow. Such as, limiting the number of times we stand up and sit, stand up and sit. My commitment is keep our original service (9:30 AM) a good "Lutheran" liturgical service. What I will be looking for are examples of Lutheran liturgies that are being used in other Lutheran churches that we know. Sunday Fellowship Time

The Intentional Father

I have been reading two books on being a father. One is by Paul Manwaring called "What Fathers Do" and the other is by Jon Tyson called The Intentional Father. I no longer have children in my home to be a father to, however, I can still work at being a better father to my kids and be a good influence for my grandkids.

What is clear about both books is that we fathers often are on our own when it comes to knowing how to be good fathers. Sometimes our work edges us out of the relationship. Well, there are all sorts of reasons. Our culture has taken out most rites of passage or training so that our kids, especially our boys, don't know what it takes to be a man or when he becomes one.

I would like to try a new thing. I would like to see if there is interest in the fathers we know, especially those who have kids at home, but also others, to get together and see how we can help each other. We only have a short time of raising our kids and then they are on their own. This is not intended to be a touchy, feely get together where we talk and do nothing. This is also for anyone in the community, member or not. Let me know if you are interested.

Bible Study

I would like to begin a Bible study for men (I can also begin one for a mixed group if needed). If you are interested in this, please let me know. Time and frequency to be determined.

Harvest Workers

Beginning in the fall I would like to invite a group to take my online Harvest Workers course on the New Testament. It is a survey, an overview, of the New Testament. There are 36 video presentations, most of them about a book of the New Testament. Students will do the prep work, including watching a video each week on their own. Then, once a week, we will gather as a group or cohort, and discuss that week's lesson. By the time we are through you will have had a fairly comprehensive overview of the New Testament and how to understand it. You will need a computer, a tablet or smartphone to access the course online. Let me know if you are interested.

NEWS RELEASE-May 6, 2023:

Early Voting Shows Life Wins as San Antonio Voters Soundly Defeat Prop A, which Would Have Decriminalized Abortion

San Antonio, TX -- Early voting results show San Antonio voters soundly defeated Prop A, a ballot initiative to decriminalize abortion. Prop A required police and other staff to ignore state laws protecting unborn babies' lives and women's health, fertility, and safety from illegal and back-alley abortions in the City of San Antonio. Prop A also contained five other provisions, including banning arrests for theft up to \$750 and vandalism up to \$2,500. Among 98,260 votes cast early, Prop A lost 74.25% - 25.75%.

Texas Alliance for Life Communications Director and former San Antonio resident Amy O'Donnell had this to say about Prop A's defeat:

"We are tremendously pleased to see that San Antonio voters have defeated Prop A so decisively. Prop A would have been tragic for unborn children and victims of trafficking who would have been left without the protection from abortion they deserve by San Antonio police. Prop A was bad news for San Antonio churches, pro-life pregnancy centers, and businesses that would become easy targets for theft and vandalism. Prop A would have put the family culture that makes the city so vibrantly alive and beautiful at risk.

We hope this defeat sends a strong message to those activists seeking to circumvent statewide laws that protect unborn babies from abortion. Gimmicks, like the bundling of the decriminalization of abortion with other measures, did not work in San Antonio. Texans won't stand for it, and our cities deserve better."

As gospel-motivated voices for ALL life, from fertilization to forever, we Lutheran Christians can never give up, never stop praying, and never stop being the hands and voices of Jesus to our neighbors who are hurting!

COUNCIL NOTES—from the April 12, 2023 Meeting

President Jerry Gass called the meeting to order at 6:05pm. Council members present were Sally Anderson, Medora Beckmann, Norman Eubank, Ashley Finch, Jerry Gass, Travis Kersten, Pastor David Mayer, Sheri Riley, Karen Steiger, Hal Switzer, and Karen Wagner. Jerry welcomed Pastor to his first official council meeting. He also complimented him on officiating at the Holy Week services. There were 162 people in attendance on Easter Sunday. Pastor David gave a devotional based on The Parable of the Talents taken from Matthew 25:14.... to consider not hiding our talents, but doing great things with what God has given us as an individual, as a council, and as a church body. He ended with a prayer.

There were no corrections to the Minutes of the March 8, 2023, Council meeting. The Benevolent Support factors were calculated by Jerry for next quarter. The gifts & reception for the Welton's went very well. Travis made a motion to accept the Minutes, Sheri seconded the motion, and the Council members accepted the motion.

Sheri gave the Financial Report for March 2023. Medora gave the Treasurer's Report as of March 24, 2023. Pastor submitted his report and expressed his appreciation for the warm welcome that he and Tanya have received.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

- <u>--Youth & Education</u> Ashley announced that the Youth Scholarship applications are due April 15th. The Scholarship committee will meet in early May. VBS pre-registration was filled quickly, and it was decided to add another rotation (25 kids) to accommodate the waiting list. Flag Football registration opened April 3rd beginning our 3rd season. Game locations have not yet been determined. Ashley also announced that Summer Camp is completely full. The Walking Prayer-a-Thon was a great time & big success. No final tally yet. It was approved that the College Girls' online Bible Study that Alexis Pawelek hosts will be funded through the Adult Bible Study.
- <u>--Stewardship</u> Sally handed out a chart of thank-you notes & letters that she had received in the past month. She will compile an introduction letter to each organization represented, introducing herself to them & giving them helpful information.
- <u>--Evangelism</u> Karen W reminded everyone that April 30th (5th Sunday) will be our next Potluck dinner after the Worship Service. No Sunday School will be held. She announced that the Women's Group will be starting a new project of cooking & freezing meals to be handed out as needed. Mary Jo Pfeiffer will head the program and Thrivent has already provided a gift card to get the program started.
- --Worship Travis gave an oral report of all areas under his leadership. All is well. Job descriptions for the paid staff are needed since Pastor David is now onboard.
- <u>--Property</u> Norman handed out his report. He received a quote from BP Lighting including Assistive Listening & Podcast Systems. Pastor purchased a cheaper microphone that might alleviate the louder volume needed. It was decided to put the quote on hold for now. The outside Church sign will include as much information as possible yet keep some parts interchangeable as information changes are added/deleted.

Travis made a motion to accept the Committee Reports and Hal seconded the motion. The motion was approved by the Council members present.

Old Business -

--The Letter of Call extended to Pastor Mayer was shown. And Pastor's Letter of Pastoral Call was discussed. Travis suggested we include the Pastoral Call Letter in the Church Newsletter.

What exactly is Harvest Workers?

Four years ago, a group of pastors began dreaming about what it might look like to create an online ministry training program that was affordable, accessible, and effectively equipped those God was calling to greater ministry with a solid biblical and theological foundation while emphasizing practical mission and ministry instruction. After all, if we were ever going to plant and revitalize churches, we needed to invest in developing more mission-minded leaders. These conversations eventually led to the Texas District's most ambitious project to date: Harvest Workers!

The program we set out to develop was not intended to be a seminary. Instead, we envisioned a ministry training program for those for whom traditional seminary might not be affordable, accessible, or the best fit. Harvest Workers actually inverts the emphasis of most seminary programs: instead of emphasizing academic studies in Bible and theology while providing a basic introduction to practical ministry, Harvest Workers introduces students to biblical and theological studies while diving more deeply into a wide variety of practical courses in mission and ministry.

Since the program is online and on-demand, there are no semesters or pre-scheduled class times. Students access courses through a personal online classroom portal and meet with their faculty one-onone for four video conference sessions. There are quizzes, papers, projects, and lots of reading as well as video lectures, as one might expect. This online, on-demand delivery is what makes the program especially unique, allowing students to work their studies into daily life.

Certificate students from the Texas District pay a subscription of \$165 a month for their tuition. We encourage congregations to partner with interested students by providing partial scholarships. St. John, Thrall has also established a scholarship fund in memory of Jon and Kathy Bielfeldt and contributions to this fund are welcomed from individuals or congregations. Harvest Workers is not the only answer to the church's need for pastors and ministry leaders, but it is an important part of our effort to better equip women and men for the Kingdom ministry to which God is calling them. Whether these students become contract pastors, church planters, youth or children's ministers, care ministers or just better equipped church members to serve in their own congregations and communities, I am excited to see the growth and development in each student.

We currently have 21 students enrolled in our certificate program and more than two dozen others have participated in taking individual courses as audit students or as a part of a church group. If you are interested in learning more about Harvest Workers, whether that is starting a group course at your church, auditing a class of interest, or becoming a full certificate student, I would invite you to check out our website at www.harvestworkers.net and reach out to start a conversation about how Harvest Workers may help equip you and others in your church to answer God's call to greater Kingdom ministry.
