



Then, once a week, we will gather as a group or cohort, and discuss that week's lesson. By the time we are through you will have had a fairly comprehensive overview of the New Testament and how to understand it. You will need a computer, a tablet or smartphone to access the course online.

#### **COUNCIL NOTES—from the May 10, 2023 Meeting**

President Jerry Gass called the meeting to order at 6:13pm. Council members present were Sally Anderson, Medora Beckmann, Ashley Finch, Jerry Gass, Pastor David Mayer, Sheri Riley, Karen Steiger, Hal Switzer, and Karen Wagner.

Pastor David gave a devotional based on thoughts from Henry Blackaby's book <u>Experiencing God</u> and Exodus 33:15. He challenged us not to substitute our accomplishments and victories over experiencing God's presence and our fellowship with Him. A living relationship with God is of utmost importance.

There were no corrections to the Minutes of the April 12, 2023, Council meeting. Action items were discussed. Including non-Council members of the congregation to help as Communion Assistants was approved. Rather than changing the Church Constitution at this time, it was decided that it would be done on a trial basis for a while. Karen W made a motion to accept the Minutes, Sheri seconded the motion, and the Council members accepted the motion.

Sheri gave the Financial Report for April 2023. Medora gave the Treasurer's Report as of April 25, 2023. Jerry reported that Angie's Quick Books version is no longer being supported, so after much searching, she decided to keep the current version, but payroll will be done <u>alongside</u> Quick Books...rather than <u>by</u> Quick Books.

Pastor David gave his report. He recommended Rocky and Melanie Chisholm for membership. He also spoke of the online app available to our members listed in the directory. Instant Church Mobile App is secured by creating an account with member's listed email address and personal password. Council members liked his idea. Pastor would also like to have devotionals and special books on hand to give out as needed.

Pastor would also like to have Bible Studies available during the week. A Harvest Workers study would probably begin this Fall. And he is very interested in providing fellowship with and mentoring among other pastors in an organized fashion.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

- --Youth & Education Ashley announced that there were three Youth Scholarship applicants... Cooper Riley, Makenzie Bellman, and Katie Skeen. The Scholarship Committee met and decided to award each of them \$1,500.00. Flag Football practice starts June 19<sup>th,</sup> and the games will be held on Saturday mornings from 9:00 to 11:00am starting July 8<sup>th</sup> until August 12<sup>th</sup>. No final figures have been totaled on the Walk-a-thon. Youth Camp will be held June 30 July 4.
- <u>--Stewardship</u> Sally will meet with Wayne Gosnell and Pastor David to put together a simplified report format of Stewardship topics and activities. Thank-you letters were received from Ethnomedia and Lutherans For Life.
- --Evangelism Karen W reported that there have been a lot of "food events". April 30<sup>th</sup> fifth Sunday potluck, May 7<sup>th</sup> first Sunday breakfast, and Pastor's Installation Reception were all successful and well attended. She will purchase roses to be handed out on Mother's Day. Monday, May 15<sup>th</sup> the Trinity Takeaways will prepare meals to be frozen and used when needed. Sunday, May 21<sup>st</sup> will be Senior Recognition Sunday. Kolton Gaskamp is our only senior. Men's Group will meet on Wednesday, May 24<sup>th</sup>.
- --Worship In Travis' absence, Jerry's only concern centered around the podcast issue which he still has not been able to discuss with Norman.
- <u>--Property</u> Norman was not available to give a report. Pastor David did confirm that several light bulbs were changed around the property, and that a baby changing table was installed in the Women's Restroom.

- The photo directory was discussed. Downloading the photos is in progress.
- Preparations for VBS (July 17-21) continue as enrollment is at maximum capacity. The last Youth Sunday School will be May 21st.
- It was suggested by Pastor that a small committee be formed to review Trinity's membership list... to review, encourage and update.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

- Pastor requested days off, May 15<sup>th</sup> &16<sup>th</sup>, while his son and daughter-in-law are visiting. July 30<sup>th</sup> is our next 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday Potluck.
- Council decided to encourage after Sunday Service fellowship by starting Sunday School at 11:00am rather than 10:45am as it is now. The Sunday Worship Service will continue to start at 9:30am. This new schedule will start on Sunday, June 4<sup>th</sup>.
- Hal began a discussion on "online giving". Kathy Kersten found a 30–40-minute demo video for those interested to watch later. Those most impacted would be Sheila getting it set up on our website, Sally as our Stewardship person, Medora as Church Treasurer, and Sheri as Church Financial Secretary.
- Hal also announced that he spoke with an attorney, saw a presentation on "legal representation" with him, and has decided to insure everyone on the Response Team through US Law Shield.

Sheri made a motion to adjourn the meeting, and Ashley seconded the motion. The meeting was adjourned at 8:05pm with everyone reciting The Lord's Prayer.

# It's Gathering Time! #SENT2023

Each year one of our highlights as a District is to come together for what we call our Annual Gathering. If you've been before, then you know what a treat it is! LCMC Texas has Gathered each summer since it's inception in 2009 with only one exception in 2020. On July 28-29, our District will gather for the 14th Annual Gathering at St. Paul's, New Braunfels! I hope you will make plans to join us this year!

Our theme for the 2023 Gathering is SENT, based on Acts 1:8. As Jesus gathered with his disciples in his final moments before ascending into heaven, he sent them out saying "...you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." What does it look like to be sent by Jesus in 2023? What does your Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria, and ends of the earth look like for you and your congregation as you respond in faith to Jesus' commissioning?

We are privileged to welcome Pastor Tilaye Daba to be our keynote speaker this year. Tilaye is the Director of the Global Mission Society for the largest and fastest growing Lutheran church body in the world: Ethiopian Evangelical Church Mekane Yesus. He has dedicated his life to the mission of Jesus and been a leader in evangelism and theological education.

Over these past several months as my excitement and anticipation of Tilaye's visit has been building, I have shared this recurring thought: While we are all quite aware of Lutheran missionaries from America traveling to Africa, I think it is pretty special that the American church is now welcoming an African missionary! We have so much to learn from the Ethiopians, especially when it comes to being Jesus' witnesses in the world around us.

If you are reading this, then please know that this Gathering is for you. This isn't a conference just for pastors or church council members. It is for someone just like you! We gather for the purpose of encouraging the whole body of Christ for the sake of his mission. We worship together around God's Word and Sacrament; we fellowship together over good food, enjoying the company of our brothers and sisters in Christ; we are inspired by excellent, faithful communicators; we network with other pastors, churches, and ministry partners; and we learn from three of the 15 different breakouts offered. So please come gather with us!

I'd be remiss if I did not also mention the Youth Gathering and Lock-in. Middle and High School students are encouraged to come for a special Youth Gathering planned just for them. The Youth Gathering takes place concurrently and includes fun games, food, teaching time, and a mission project. Students will stay the night in the church facility, so no lodging is required.
