### **Harvest Workers New Testament Course**

I am very impressed by the number of people who have signed up for the Harvest Workers video-based course on the New Testament, Matthew through Revelation. It requires an internet connection, watching a 30 minute videos on your own each week and some other preparation. Once a week we will meet at church as a "cohort" to discuss that week's video. In fact, we will have two identical sessions, once on Monday morning around 10:30 AM (TBD) and once on Monday evening around 6:00 PM (TBD). For those who would rather jump into the pages of the Bible in a more hands on study, we will begin this after the Harvest Workers course begins. We will meet sometime during the daytime Monday through Thursday. I have to watch how many evenings I commit myself to. If there are too many for one group, it might be that there is someone who is good at leading a group and who is able and willing to lead a Bible study who can lead one group.

## Mission Moment

### **Gathered & SENT**

As I sit down to write this article, my mind is full of all the last-minute arrangements that are yet to be completed for our 2023 District Gathering in New Braunfels, Texas. Yet as many of you read this, the Gathering itself will already be in the rearview mirror. I am praying for a wonderful Gathering that inspires and empowers God's people to be SENT by Jesus to be his witnesses in the world!

Our theme this year is SENT and is derived from Jesus giving the Great Commission in Acts 1:8, "You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." It is my firm belief that the church is defined by its mission. We do not simply occupy space in this world while consuming resources. We are SENT by Jesus for a mission! The challenge is for each person, and every congregation to discern what that looks like in your day-to-day life in your community and context.

I would like to invite you to take inventory of all the activities that occupy your day-to-day life, both personally as well as for your church. Typically, our lives are filled with those activities that could be broadly categorized in one of three groups: activities required to sustain life, the things that we enjoy, and then everything else! While it may be worth analyzing the stewardship of all three categories, it is this third that needs our greatest attention.

Here we may identify things that we do because of others' expectations, or traditions that simply haven't been broken or updated, and even things that we have no idea why we do them! It is tempting to replace these activities with more things that we enjoy. But I would suggest that we focus instead on pursuing mission, our God-given purpose. This third category ought to be filled with God-directed and empowered activities of purpose connected to what Jesus SENT us to do and be!

For example, churches often adopt patterns of ministry that were designed with a mission to reach their communities with the Gospel of Jesus Christ generations ago. Many churches still fill their time and expend their energy trying to maintain these same activities that were once integral to the church's mission but stopped being effective decades ago. Sometimes we need to pause and rethink what we are doing and both why and how we are doing it. Is this how Jesus is sending us to be his witnesses to our community today?

I am excited for our Gathering because we gather for a purpose. Just like Jesus' first followers in Acts 1:8, we gather to be encouraged, inspired, empowered... and SENT by Jesus to live with a mission and on purpose in our communities.

### **COUNCIL NOTES—from the June 14, 2023 Meeting**

President Jerry Gass called the meeting to order at 6:04pm. Council members present were Medora Beckmann, Norman Eubank, Ashley Finch, Jerry Gass, Travis Kersten, Pastor David Mayer, Sheri Riley, Karen Steiger, Hal Switzer, and Karen Wagner. Pastor David gave a devotional on Faith Active in Love, with a Martin Luther emphasis. Good works do not save us but flow from God's saving gift of faith. Ephesians 2:1-10. There were no corrections to the Minutes of the May 10, 2023, Council meeting.

The Action Items were discussed. A more concise Church Mission Statement would be one of the items we can address at our Council Retreat perhaps in early Fall. Jerry complimented Pastor on how complete & detailed his input is. A small group to review Church membership has been formed and is planning to meet in the middle of July. Ashley made a motion to accept the Minutes, Hal seconded the motion, and the Council members approved the motion.

Sheri gave the Financial Report for May 2023. There are still some issues with Paychex's compatibility alongside Quick Books that should be resolved by next month. Medora gave the Treasurer's Report as of May 25, 2023.

Pastor David submitted his report. He encouraged everyone to feel comfortable bringing concerns to him and letting him know of visitations that are necessary... the sooner the better. New members will be received next Sunday. Three youth are eligible for confirmation instruction, and a discipleship course is being planned for a 9<sup>th</sup> Grade member or any adult needing to be confirmed. Pastor announced he is going to camp with the Youth, not as a sponsor but as a presence to get to hang out with the kids. Ray Wolbrecht will preach on Sunday, July 2<sup>nd</sup> when Pastor is at Youth Camp. Pastor is also asking a guest pastor to preach on Sunday, July 30<sup>th</sup>. The LCMC Annual Gathering will be held July 28<sup>th</sup> & 29<sup>th</sup> at St. Paul Lutheran Church in New Braunfels. Jim & Barb Geistfeld have offered to be delegates for Trinity since Barb is planning to attend anyway as a representative for Lutherans for Life.

### Committee Reports—

<u>Youth & Education</u> – Ashley reported that Layla Lukich & Creed Finch painted a wall in the Fellowship Hall. And a new Announcement Board will be hung outside the Youth Room door. Youth Sunday School will resume on Sunday, August 13<sup>th</sup>. And that will also be the Blessing of the Backpacks Sunday. Youth go to Camp Eagle from June 30-July 4. On Father's Day Sunday the Youth will pass out gifts they have assembled to the men of the Congregation. Laurie Parker has requested the use of a table in the Fellowship Hall for tutoring students in reading on the mornings that her daughter Lainie has Meals on Wheels and will be in the Fellowship Hall already.

<u>Stewardship</u> – Sally had no report to submit. Jerry did report that we had received a thank-you note from The Wellness Fair committee expressing their appreciation to our CMOB men who provided food for the event.

<u>Evangelism</u> – Karen W announced that starting Thursday night Trinity will host a movie night. Sharon Wolbrecht & Cindy Hawkins are organizing this, with the first movie being "God is ..not.. Dead". The men will host breakfast before Worship on Sunday, July 2<sup>nd</sup>. In reference to after Worship fellowship refreshments, Karen W announced that rather than having a sign-up sheet, she would just call different women in the Women's Group to volunteer bringing food… at least until after VBS. Then the issue will be revisited.

<u>Worship</u> – Travis announced that all with the Ushers is running smoothly. There is no need for Usher Teams at this point. Sheila Mercer has two properly trained substitutes in the Media Ministry...Pam Nabers and Grayson

Culton. Travis said the Job Descriptions were coming along nicely. Ashley announced that Alexis will bring the directory pictures on a USB drive this Sunday, so Angie can get them uploaded to the directory.

<u>Property</u> – Norman presented his report. Highlights: Richard Culpepper has cancelled all his work, so we are now going to use Refrigeration of Texas once a year unless specific needs occur. Our regular lawn mowing person has "retired", so Norman is looking for someone else. He is relocating bulletin boards in the office hallway. Norman briefly discussed upgrading Pastor's office. The outside church sign will be updated with current information. Norman has talked to Sally Anderson about helping him do that.

Norman made a motion to accept the Committee Reports and Ashley seconded the motion. The motion was approved by the Council members present.

### Old Business –

The Communion Assistants schedule was completed through September 24th.

#### New Business -

Council decided that Trinity should continue to support Teen Challenge financially & prayerfully, but not have them give presentations. Perhaps we could invite Chris with Fellowship of Christian Athletes to meet with our youth on Youth Sunday, August 13<sup>th</sup>.

Regarding the LCMC Gathering held in New Braunfels on July 28 & 29, Travis made a motion to support Jim & Barb Geistfeld as Trinity's delegates. Ashley seconded the motion, and the Council approved the motion. Pastor David will make an announcement to the congregation Sunday for anyone else interested in attending the Gathering.

Jerry announced that Trinity was a recipient of a PEC United Charities donation. It was decided to use this money for the youth ministry. The youth Walk-a-Thon raised about \$6.000.00. A discussion of another possible fundraiser took place...to rent parking spaces during next year's Lavender Festival and/or during the total solar eclipse taking place next April.

Hal has received an inquiry from a woman wanting to put a 7' by 14' coffee truck on our property. She would provide her own power & water. Her vehicle would be mobile enough to move when we need our total parking lot space. She needs to have an address before she can apply for the permits, insurance, etc. she needs.

Hal announced that the Investment Committee met on June 8 with our Thrivent advisor. He recommended 6 different bond funds in which to invest our Thrivent money. Upon the approval of the committee, Ray will invest this money in increments each month divided among these 6 money market bond funds, hoping for a 4-5% increase.

A discussion concerning money in the Building Fund checking account at TRB resulted in a decision to transfer some of it to a CD. Hal Switzer made a motion for a set amount to be transferred out of Trinity's Building Fund at Texas Regional Bank (TRB) to purchase a 6-month CD at TRB. Sheri Riley seconded the motion, and the Council members approved the motion.

Pastor David requested vacation time on Labor Day weekend.

Upcoming events include Men's Group meeting at Kevin Hawkins house on Tuesday, June 20<sup>th</sup>. And the men will be preparing breakfast on Sunday, July 2<sup>nd</sup>.

Sheri made a motion to adjourn the meeting, and Travis seconded the motion. The meeting was adjourned at 8:05pm with everyone reciting The Lord's Prayer.
