Notes from the August 9, 2023 Council of Ministries Meeting

President Jerry Gass called the meeting to order at 6:10pm. Council members present were Sally Anderson, Medora Beckmann, Norman Eubank, Ashley Finch, Jerry Gass, Travis Kersten, Pastor David Mayer, Sheri Riley, Karen Steiger, and Karen Wagner. Pastor David's devotional "Is it ok for us to pray for ourselves?" was based on Psalm 67. When we pray for God to bless us and then praise Him for those blessings, that allows His ways to be made known on the earth and His salvation to be given among all nations.

The Minutes of the July 12, 2023, Council meeting were amended. Sheri made a motion to accept the Minutes as amended, and Travis seconded the motion. The Council members voted to approve the motion.

Sheri gave the Financial Report for July 2023, and Medora gave the Treasurer's Report as of July 25, 2023.

Pastor David submitted his report and discussed it in detail. A Membership Committee consisting of Pastor, Hal Switzer, Angie Daniels, Karla Riley, and Karen Wagner was formed to review the Trinity family and to have a current Voting Member list available. Pastor announced plans for a Confirmation Class. A 2-day Global Leadership Summit is in the planning stages for next August. Pastor would like to buy 10+ registrations at the super early bird rate by August 11th, then perhaps having the Chicago event livestreamed at Trinity. Travis made a motion to allow Pastor to purchase Global Leadership Summit tickets out of his cellphone budget. Ashley seconded the motion, and the Council members approved the motion. Jim & Barb Geistfeld, Jim Clifton, Leta Garcia, and Pastor & Tanya represented Trinity at the LCMC Texas District Annual Gathering which was held July 28-29 at St. Paul Lutheran Church in New Braunfels.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

- --Youth and Education Ashley announced that next year's VBS theme will be 'Jungle Cruise Through the Amazon'. She is looking into next year's Camp taking on a different form in that TLC would rent a retreat-type house and formulate its own curriculum & teaching. She also announced that this Sunday, August 13 would be a VBS closet cleanup time; as well as, starting Children's Sunday School and the Blessing of the Backpacks Sunday for all students returning to school. The Community Youth Garage Sale is tentatively set for Saturday, October 21.
- --Stewardship Sally is moving forward to establish goals & a clear purpose by planning a meeting with Pastor David and Wayne Gosnell; then using the Church Constitution to outline specific responsibilities. It was suggested that she have several people on her committee to help with these responsibilities. Sally had received thank-you notes from The Blanco County Child Protective Services, Ethnomedia, and Adult & Teen Challenge.
- <u>--Evangelism</u> Karen W reported that the Fellowship Refreshments sign-up is filled for the next 6 weeks, and the breakfast on Sunday, August 6th was a success. Claudia Smith is back, and she & Angie are making plans for a Women's Group meeting.
- <u>--Worship</u> Travis reported that all is going well. He reminded us that Chris with the Blanco FCA will give a Temple Talk this Sunday at the beginning of the worship service. Sheila Mercer, as Media Director, is responsible for maintaining & updating TLC's website, TLC's Facebook page, and operations in the Media Room.
- <u>--Property</u> Norman submitted his report. Quite a few maintenance items were dealt with, mostly involving water leaks. Please refer to his report for the details. Most of the work on Pastor's office renovation is complete. A security mirror for the hall is still on backorder and an underground leak is yet to be found. Pastor David complimented Norman on his availability and willingness to tackle any problem or issue that occurs. Congrats on a job well done as Property Manager!

Travis made a motion to accept all the Committee Reports and Sheri seconded the motion. The Council members approved the motion.

Lord, Open Our Eyes!

Have you ever found yourself reading a familiar Bible story when suddenly you are struck with a revelation? Isn't it a joy to read and receive Good News in fresh ways?!?

Recently I was reading Matthew 20 and read once again the story of Jesus healing two blind men along the road outside of Jericho. Jesus performed so many miracles and healings that we are prone to sometimes gloss over them and miss the magnitude of what is happening. Compared to his many other miracles, this one can seem mundane.

In this particular story, the two blind men had heard that Jesus was going to be passing by on the road. So, they began crying out to Jesus: "Lord, have mercy on us, Son of David!" While the crowds sought to shush them, the blind men were persistent in their cries. Hearing their persistence, Jesus calls out to the blind men, "What do you want me to do?" The men replied "Lord, open our eyes." Jesus healed their sight and immediately they followed Jesus.

I wonder how much spiritual blindness we suffer from and simply have not had the faith, wisdom, or courage to cry out with any persistence "Lord, have mercy" to our miracle-working, sight-giving Lord. All too often we endure a less than abundant, faith-filled life, unable to see God and his activity in the world in order to both delight and participate in it.

All around our District I meet devoted church members and leaders who earnestly desire the church to be healthy, strong, and often return to a day of former vitality. Yet I am convinced more than ever that the journey of following Jesus includes the courage of blind men and women crying out to Jesus, "Lord, have mercy on us!" And when the pressures from within the church and out in the world both conspire to silence the faithful pleas for mercy, we are called to persist with an expectant, hopeful faith.

I believe that Jesus will hear the cries of the faithful. When he asks, "What do you want me to do?" I pray that we can have the simple and pure faith to ask for vision: "Lord, open our eyes." Open our eyes to see you for who you are... to see ourselves for who we are... to see your kingdom... to see our neighbors... to see the least, and the lost, and the left out. Jesus is faithful and will answer that prayer and give new vision.

Just imagine the life-giving renewal that Jesus could usher in through humble, honest, and faithful congregations following Jesus into their future with clarity of vision and purpose!
