## Christmas...Incarnation...God become flesh...Jesus, born in a manger...

Have you considered the amazing wonder of God coming in such a way that in Jesus we know we have "the image of the invisible God?" God is a missionary God. He made sure that his love was expressed in a way and in a language that we can understand. The language is Jesus. Jesus "was in the form of God," he "emptied himself," "being born in human likeness," "he became obedient to the point of death on the cross" (Philippians 2:6-8).

God did the missionary thing and used the language of our experience, our joys, our pain, our culture, our manner of speech so that we could understand this important truth: we matter to God; God loves the world (John 3:16,17). God is going to great lengths to get this across to us. As people who have come to know this love and purpose we are called to be missionaries to take the Christmas truth to all our world. We find ourselves in the tradition of the shepherds who couldn't keep it to themselves; "Go tell it on the mountain...and everywhere."

Former missionary Leslie Newbigin states, "It is the work of the sovereign Spirit to enable men and women in new situations and in new cultural forms to find ways in which the confession of Jesus as Lord may be made in the language of their own culture. The mission of the church is in fact the church's obedient participation in that action of the Spirit by which the confession of Jesus as Lord becomes the authentic confession of ever new peoples, each in its own language." This is Christmas lived out.

#### How does Christmas come to people for the first time?

**George Hunter III**, in his book, *"Church For the Unchurched,"* gives Ten Pioneering Principles of Outreach in Apostolic Churches:

**1. They prepare their people in multiple ways.**" The apostolic church prepares its people for witness and invitation by rooting them in Scripture, deepening them in prayer, teaching them compassion for sinners and obedience to the Great Commission, and by scripting them with an apostolic vision of what people can become. The apostolic church further prepares the way for outreach by involving its people in pastoral care, small groups, and lay ministries, and by offering many ministries to pre-Christian people – including a celebrative culturally relevant worship service that eliminates the 'cringe factor 'and frees Christians to invite their friends."

**2. They clarify the goal of outreach.** "Apostolic churches are clear that the goal of the gospel's communication is not merely to persuade people to believe, accept Christ's benefits, and join the ranks of nominal

Christians...Nominal Christianity does not meet the deep needs of people's souls." The goal of outreach is to bring people to become fully devoted followers of Jesus Christ. If no difference can be seen between a pagan and a "Christian" in name only, then the work is also necessary among those nominal Christians.

**3. They see evangelism is a process.** Joining is not enough. Conversion is not enough. Evangelism is a process of bringing people to maturity in Christ.

**4. They regard outreach as a lay ministry.** The "amateurs" have been shown to outperform the "professionals" (pastors).

**5.** They train their people for outreach. First, the whole church needs to be prepared for outreach, but most people are not ready without specific training.

6. They practice social network evangelism. They use the web of influence among family and friends.

**7. They offer "the faith once delivered to the saints.**" They are true to the Scriptures and the faith passed on, not to be dogmatically correct, but because God's truth meets people's needs.

8. They address the "life concerns" of pre-Christian (and Christians). They address daily issues of life and not only the theological principles of the faith. An apostolic congregation studies the target population and takes them seriously.

9. They use the language of the target population.

**10. They represent the gospel with generational relevance.** Apostolic congregations recognize that the culture can change from one generation to the next. "If the churches simply perpetuate the forms the old people like, they risk missing a generation of non-Christians and losing the rising generation of Christians."

Merry Christmas from the Mayers. May the traditions of Christmas fill you with love and joy. May God's Christmas story challenge and motivate us to bring the gospel of Jesus to all people.

## Advent: More Than a Countdown

As a kid, I LOVED Advent! Why? Because it was a countdown to the best day of the year in the minds of most kids: Christmas! Why? Because Christmas meant PRESENTS! What kid doesn't love getting to unwrap Christmas presents?!? As I have grown and matured (hopefully) I have come to realize that Advent is so much more than a countdown... it is an invitation to give the best gift of all: God's grace through Jesus.

Entering the season of Advent, we are reminded of the extraordinary gift of God's grace given in the advent or arrival of Emmanuel (God with us), Jesus. As we anticipate the Christmas celebration and reflect upon the gift of God's grace in sending His son, I can't help but take note of what I think is often overlooked: our call to share that grace with others. Advent is a season of intentional love and outreach in Jesus' name.

Our call to share Christ's love is rooted in our identity as recipients of a grace that knows no bounds. It is God's grace that forgives our sins, heals our brokenness, and transforms our lives. Grace is a free gift of God that can never be earned or deserved. Jesus reminds his followers Matthew 10:8 (CSB): "*Freely received, freely give.*" As followers of Christ this Advent season, we are called not only to celebrate this grace but to be conduits of it, sharing the transformative love of Christ with the world we live in.

In the hustle and bustle of this season, be attentive to the opportunities that God gives you to be instruments of God's grace for others. How can you joyfully demonstrate the love of Jesus in your interactions with friends, family, neighbors, co-workers and even strangers? It could be as simple as extending a helping hand to a neighbor, showing kindness to a stranger, or speaking a word of encouragement. It may be through sharing the story of Christ's birth, offering a listening ear to someone going through a tough time, or extending forgiveness in Jesus' name. Pray each day for God to give you eyes to see the opportunities and the courage and power of the Holy Spirit to embrace them. I believe God will indeed answer your prayer and give you both!

This Advent, I pray that our lives can be a testament to the transformative power of grace, as we actively and intentionally extend God's love to a world in need. In 1 Peter 4:10 (CSB) we read, "Based on the gift each one has received, use it to serve others, as good managers of the varied grace of God." Our faith calls for us to respond to God's grace by not just receiving it but also stewarding it by sharing it generously with a world that so desperately needs it.

"I received an email from Timothy, who wanted to submit an entry in our Lutherans For Life essay contest. Writing is a challenge for him, so he used "talk to text" to write his essay while his mother asked questions. It turns out that Timothy, a sixth grader from southern Minnesota, has Down syndrome. I was so moved by Timothy's essay that I gave him an award ...called the "Spotlight Award." It is given to a student who did not win anything in our contest but who wrote an essay from a unique perspective. What stood out was his statement that he has *"autism, Down syndrome, and Baptism."* 

"My name is Timothy. My name means "valued by God." I live in Minnesota. I live with my mom, dad, and sisters—Abby and Hannah. I am in sixth grade. I like classes at school like P.E., band, choir, social



studies, and Mrs. Momberg's class. I play trombone and piano. I like to listen to Christian music in my bedroom. I like to play games with my family. I have autism, Down syndrome, and Baptism. Baptism means I'm God's child. I love everyone. I like riding my bike. I want to travel to Waupaca so I can kayak. I like to sing to God and I lead my family in praise songs during family devotions. I love God. I was in a video with my friends. [YouTube: World Down Syndrome Day Video for Kids] Lots of schools saw it. It was about World Down Syndrome Day explained for kids.

God loves everybody. God loves people that are big and small. God loves people that are every age. God loves people no matter where we live. All people are special to God. The Bible says, "For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand" (Ephesians 2:10). God has good things for each of us."

## Notes from the Church Council Meeting on October 18, 2023

President Jerry Gass called the meeting to order at 6:03pm. Council members present were Medora Beckmann, Norman Eubank, Ashley Finch, Jerry Gass, Travis Kersten, Pastor David Mayer, Sheri Riley, Hal Switzer, and Karen Wagner. Guest, Keith Morgenroth, a member of the Budget Committee had been invited by Hal to observe the financial operations/discussions of the Council meeting. Pastor gave a devotional on Powerful People, Powerful Relationships. Powerful people do not try to control other people. They don't try to get people to respect them; they create a respectful environment by showing respect.

There were no corrections to the Minutes of September 20, 2023. Travis Kersten made the motion to accept the Minutes, Hal Switzer seconded the motion, and the Council members voted to approve the motion. Sheri Riley gave the Financial Report through September 2023, and Medora Beckmann gave the Treasurer's Report as of September 25, 2023. A discussion was held concerning how the PEC gift could be used, concluding it be placed in the Undesignated Pass thru (Liability 3a) for now. Travis made a motion to move the Building Fund monies into an account earning higher interest. Hal seconded the motion, and the Council members voted to approve the motion.

Pastor David submitted his report. 5 funerals have been held since our last Council meeting. He met with the 6 Confirmation students on September 16<sup>th</sup>. Their next meeting will be October 28<sup>th</sup>. Pastor attended The LCMC Annual Gathering Oct 1-4 in St Charles, Missouri. He announced that the Instant Church Mobile App has been updated with new photos thanks to Alexis Pawelek. Harvest Workers Bible Study meets on Mondays at 10:00am and 6:00pm. And the new Bible Study will start this coming week on Tuesday, October 24<sup>th</sup> at 10:30am. He will be conducting a wedding in Porter for Hondo friends, so has requested vacation days on December 2-3. And he and Tanya are requesting one extra week of vacation to the one already planned after Christmas to visit their daughter and family in Nairobi, Kenya.

## COMMITTEE REPORTS:

<u>-Youth and Education</u> – Ashley announced that the Youth Rummage Sale will be held October 21<sup>st</sup> from 7:00am-6:00pm. Trinity will be hosting the 5<sup>th</sup> Quarter event on October 27<sup>th</sup> after the football game. The Youth are planning an outing to the Corn Maze on October 29<sup>th</sup>. And on November 9<sup>th</sup> Trinity will be hosting a Middle School Football players and Cheerleaders event.

-Stewardship - Correspondence and Thank-yous were received from ILT, Ethnomedia, Vina and Young Life.

<u>-Evangelism</u> – Karen W. announced that the 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday Potluck would be October 29<sup>th</sup>. Stephen Ministry has 4 new recruits. Karen W. has been busy stocking the pantry, and the Women's Group is looking for a new leader.

<u>-Worship</u> – Travis reported that all is well with the Ushers, Pianist, and the Altar Guild. Leta Garcia is enjoying her time in Ireland. Sheila is dealing with a few media issues. During funerals the words to the hymns will be printed.

<u>-Property</u> – Norman submitted his report. The Fellowship Hall bathroom windows were frosted to provide more privacy. A new Bunn coffee maker was purchased and set up. Pending projects include updating the outside sign, underground water leaks, and repairing/replacing the water damaged cabinet at the ice machine.

Sheri made a motion to accept all the Committee reports and Travis seconded the motion. The Council members voted to approve the motion.

## <u>Old Business</u> –

The Communion Assistants Schedule is complete through the end of the year. The Coffee Truck operation is pending the city meetings to grant permits. It was discussed that perhaps the rent collected from the Truck could go into the Youth Scholarship Fund. The Council Retreat will be held on Saturday, November 11<sup>th</sup> at the Fellowship Hall from 12:00pm-3:00pm (eat lunch ahead of time). And the Congregational Meeting to elect incoming Council members will be held Sunday, November 12<sup>th</sup>. Hal is working with the 2024 Budget Committee to have the numbers ready for the November council meeting.

## New Business -

Christmas Eve Sunday there will be two services: a regular morning service at 9:30am and an evening service at 5:00pm.

Norman made a motion to accept \$6,700. as the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter Benevolence amount. Sheri seconded the motion, and the Council members approved the motion. There will be no Movie Night on Thursday, November 9<sup>th</sup>.

Sheri made a motion to adjourn the meeting, Hal seconded the motion, and the Council approved the motion. The meeting was adjourned at 8:04pm with everyone reciting The Lord's Prayer.
