

Confirmation Over! Over?

We will celebrate the faith testimony on April 7th! This brings together two things that are together in Scripture: faith and baptism. The free gift of salvation offered in baptism and the faith in the One who saves. It is not that there has been no faith up until Confirmation. It is that six of our youth will make a public proclamation of faith. "For if you declare with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved."

They will be finished with our fun and productive gatherings we have had on Saturday mornings, but they will be beginning their journey as intentional disciples of Jesus. Since they will profess their faith all their future participation decisions will be theirs to make right? If not, then you will know that the faith they express is like a tender plant planted in the garden. That plant needs fertilizer, watering, weeding and care so that their faith will not die, but grow through the love and presence of the Holy Spirit.

Contemporary Worship Service

Trinity Lutheran Church has the happy problem of bumping up against the limits of our growth potential based on space. We know that growth means we are alive and that what we are doing and what we are as church attracts unchurched to Jesus and the fellowship of faith. The plan is for us to begin a second worship service, and one that is contemporary in style.

Since a contemporary worship service will involve guitars and such instruments, we need to "shake the instrument players out of the trees" or attract those who are not yet part of our family to join us. We should not think that an undertaking like this is all about human planning and gifts. Part of what needs to be worked out is a time for the service on Sunday morning. Council has mentioned possibly moving our 9:30 service to 9:00 AM. Sunday school could then be at 10:15 AM, and the second service could be at 11:15 or 11:30 AM. Since we can't control who will attend the contemporary service, there will be a natural feeling of loss when some of our people will attend the second service. Two responses: one, we can reconnect, if it is important to us, during the Sunday school hour, and two, we have to keep in mind that the second service is an act of faithfulness to the Great Commission. We need to reach the next generations and people who are more comfortable with a contemporary style. Therefore, we need to be in prayer for God's blessing and leading and protection. I think this is an amazing adventure for the Kingdom of God. We will begin small to get our feet wet, to develop our style and to draw musicians together. Keep an eye out for a meeting on April 17th for a gathering of those interested in this. And again, let us pray!

Speaking Truth in Love

"But speaking the truth in love, let us grow in every way into him who is the head—Christ." - Eph. 4:15

I was recently asked my opinion regarding how churches, pastors and followers of Jesus should talk about difficult, hot-button topics in a way that is faithful but also does not exacerbate the divisions that often exist between us and the very people we are called to reach with the Gospel. This is an excellent question and is worthy of thoughtful reflection and conversation. I hope that this might spur-on thoughtful dialogue for you and your church as each of us wrestles with the tension between being faithful to what we know to be true and honoring God by loving those who do not share our faith or worldview.

While homosexuality happened to be the topic of interest for this person, similar questions have been asked about abortion and gender identity as well as other contentious topics where a biblical morality and a sense of personal freedom collide. Regardless of what the hot-button topic is, effectively communicating the Gospel is an ongoing challenge for any follower of Jesus. So how do we handle these sensitive topics while being mindful of our mission? We need to speak the truth in love.

Relationships are key to transformational love. The adage "people don't care about what you know until they know that you care" rings true. I don't think anyone had their worldview or moral systems rearranged because they were argued into agreement. Our priority must be to get into a position to influence another person. This happens best by building an authentic, loving relationship with people who order their beliefs differently than we do. How do we do this? We find a common interest, make an investment of time, and ask questions of genuine curiosity all while enjoying and celebrating the gift of sharing time. At some point, your new friend will likely reciprocate with curiosity and interest in you and what you believe. Eventually, God will give you opportunities for sharing the Gospel, opening the door for authentic transformation.

Attentive to the work of the Holy Spirit in these moments, courageously meet your new friend right where they are with the truth spoken in love. Recall the compassionate love of God that meets you in your sin, brokenness, and the arrogance of your better ideas. Draw upon that well, seeking to reflect God's love in your own relationship with the person you are ministering to. Embodying the love of Jesus is critical as we share biblical truth and introduce the Gospel of salvation. With patience, persevere in loving those who see things differently. Remember: they are not an enemy to be conquered... they are the prize to be won!

Notes from the Church Council Meeting on February 14, 2024

President Jerry Gass called the meeting to order at 7:17pm, immediately following the Ash Wednesday Worship service. Council members present were Sally Anderson, Medora Beckmann, Norman Eubank, Ashley Finch, Jerry Gass, Pastor David Mayer, Sheri Riley, Karen Steiger, Hal Switzer, and Karen Wagner. Keith Morgenroth was also in attendance to comment on our Profit & Loss reporting. As member input, he will propose a new P & L reporting format because of increased interest rates and Trinity's increased cash reserves.

Pastor David started the meeting with a blessing and prayer for the Holy Spirits' guidance. Keith suggested reporting church operations and investment activities separately. This would not change the numbers. It will, however, allow the P & L to highlight the two different areas. Church operations would continue to be budgeted; whereas the Investment activities would just be reported in such a way to give a summary of those activities as they occur. Council members agreed to begin using this new format. Norman made the motion, Ashley seconded the motion, and the Council members present approved the motion.

Jerry reminded everyone that Trinity's Operating Bank Account again has a surplus amount that can be transferred to a CD. Hal Switzer made a motion to move funds from the TLC Operating Fund to purchase a 6-month CD at Texas Regional Bank. Ashley Finch seconded the motion, and the Council members present approved the motion.

There were no corrections to the Minutes of January 17th Council Meeting. Ashley announced that she is still gathering the Scholarship Committee. Ashley made a motion to accept the Minutes as printed, Sheri seconded the motion, and the Council members present approved the motion.

Sheri gave the Financial Report through January 2024. Medora gave the Treasurer's Report as of January 30, 2024. Pastor David submitted his report. Confirmation is planned for Sunday, April 7th, with a dress rehearsal at 4:00pm on Friday, April 5th. Six students will be confirmed. Pastor is planning a visit from Pastor Simon Haamer from the Estonia Lutheran Church on Wednesday, Feb. 28th. He would share his & his family's testimony under Communist rule during the Lenten Service, as it applies to this year's theme: "You meant it for evil, God meant it for good".

Committee Reports:

- <u>-Youth and Education</u> Ashley announced that registration for VBS will be available at the end of February for members' families, with the general public registration to begin at the end of March. Scholarship applications are available in the Narthex, and Angie is also sending out emails. Ashley received a thank you card from the Blanco Elementary School Counselor for Trinity's participation in The Angel Tree project, and our continuous support of our local students. 10 campers are confirmed for Summer Camp so far. Trinity will sponsor 2 Youth Ball teams this Spring. Ashley's T-ball team (starts April 6th), and The Hesskew's 12-yr olds softball team are the two teams this season.
- <u>-Stewardship</u> Sally had no report at this time. Sheila Mercer is a member of the Blanco School Foundation, and she presented Jerry with a letter to consider donating to the Foundation on behalf of Trinity Lutheran Church. It was decided to table the matter at this time to allow for more specific discussion with Sheila.
- <u>-Evangelism</u> Karen W reported that cakes would be ordered to serve at the fellowship time following The Confirmation service. The next 5th Sunday Potluck is not until Sunday, June 30th. We are skipping Easter Sunday, March 31st which is also a 5th Sunday.
- -Worship No report was submitted.
- <u>-Property</u> Norman submitted his report, and discussed various maintenance issues he has taken care of. Concerning the project of painting the Fellowship Hall, several color selections were discussed. Beige and green seem to be the best choice. Norman is receiving several quotes on painting and carpet replacement in the Sanctuary. The carpeted floor is not to include the floor in the Narthex area, which is marked off past the accordion doors. Hoffman Floors in New Braunfels will include a moving company to move the furniture as part of their bid on new carpet installation. Norman is also getting quotes on lighting the parking lot.

Ashley made a motion to accept the Committee reports, Karen W seconded the motion, and the Council members approved the motion.

Hal reported that Briana requested last month's Coffee Truck rent be pro-rated because she was closed for a week during the freezing weather. Council members agreed with her request. Her rent payments go into the Unallocated Funds a/c. Sunday employees should notify the Church office of known absences. Angie has posted a master calendar on her wall for such absences.

<u>New Business</u> – Pastor David introduced the idea of having regular Church members give Communion to shut ins. The team of interested persons would receive training and provide another layer of visitation besides The Pastor and The Stephen Ministers. The Council members liked his idea. Sunday, April 21st will be Life Sunday celebrated at Trinity.

When considering a Contemporary Service, Pastor suggested we try different options (times, format, etc.) before actually incorporating one. Mass mailings are still an option when announcing a new service(s).

Jerry announced that Trinity's membership at Sam's Club has been renewed. Alexis Pawalek, Norman, Karen W, and Bonnie Triesch should have membership cards.

Upcoming Events include the Lenten meal before the Feb 21st Wednesday night Service that will be a Baked Potato bar hosted by Team Deborah. No Lenten suppers before the Maundy Thursday & Good Friday services.

Sheri made a motion to adjourn the meeting, Hal seconded the motion, and the Council members approved the motion. The meeting was adjourned at 9:07pm with everyone reciting The Lord's Prayer.
