

Holy Week marked the one-year mark for me at Trinity Lutheran. There has been some good "water under the bridge," although not a whole lot of water over the dam, with the Blanco River running dry. Unless you all are good at hiding things, I haven't seen any tar and feathers. Therefore, I am looking forward to another year.

As I look forward to doing good things, I know there is a matter of the foundation of our plans that we need to work on. That foundation is prayer. It is too easy for capable people to forget what Proverbs 16:9 reminds us of, "The heart of man plans his way, but the Lord establishes his steps." We want to make sure that our plans are in line with and have the blessing of the Lord, so that He establishes what He wants. It is safe to say that only praying people are able to discern the will of God and stay in step with the Spirit of God.

In the second chapter of Daniel, it says that Nebuchadnezzar, the king of Babylon, had a dream that troubled him. He asked the impossible of his wise men. He not only asked for the interpretation of it, he asked for what the dream was. If they did not tell him the dream and its interpretation, the king was going to have all the wise men put to death. Daniel, Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego, slaves in the king's court, exiles from Judah, were affected by the edict.

Daniel's response was to go to his three friends and ask them to plead for mercy from God by revealing this mystery. They prayed! During the night God revealed the dream to Daniel in a vision. He burst out in praise to God: "Blessed be the name of God forever and ever, to whom belong wisdom and might. He changes times and seasons; he removes kings and sets up kings; he gives wisdom to the wise and knowledge to those who have understanding; he reveals deep and hidden things; he knows what is in the darkness, and the light dwells with him. To you, O God of my fathers, I give thanks and praise, for you have given me wisdom and might, and have now made known to me what we asked of you, for you have made known to us the king's matter."

As a result, Daniel told the king the dream and its meaning, saving not only his life, but the lives of many others. Interestingly, it was a vision of a statue that represented the kingdoms from Babylonian, Persian, Greek and then to the Roman Empire, which would be toppled by a "stone cut out of a mountain." It is a clear reference to Jesus and his kingdom. The point for us? It was a living relationship with the living God exemplified by worship, yes; faithful obedience, yes; and prayer.

Trinity Lutheran needs the support of a team who will stand in the gap together in prayer on behalf of our people, our mission and all we do. I see a team of men and women, or one team of men, and one team of women, who gather weakly and intercede for our needs as well as for wisdom and knowledge that we cannot have without God answering our prayer. I can see us gathering for 30-40 minutes a week. This will not be a gossip session, or a social group, but a prayer group. We will practice being more impressed with God's power and goodness than with the problems and challenges we pray for. Let me know if the Spirit of God is calling you.

COUNCIL NOTES—from the March 13, 2024 Meeting

President Jerry Gass called the meeting to order at 6:53pm, immediately following the Lenten Worship service. Council members in attendance were Sally Anderson, Medora Beckmann, Norman Eubank, Ashley Finch, Jerry Gass, Pastor David Mayer, Sheri Riley, Karen Steiger, Hal Switzer, and Karen Wagner. Pastor David started the meeting with a prayer for guidance, faith, courage, and wisdom as we attempt to move TLC forward in love & concern, bringing honor and glory to God in Jesus' Name.

There were no corrections to the Minutes of the February 14th Council meeting. Sally suggested we contact Seymour's Garage (across from Lowe's Grocery) about putting up a banner, which she can make, instead of a Billboard notation carrying a Christian message from Trinity. According to Karen W. and Jerry billboard rentals tend to be quite expensive. Hal is still exploring our options for electronic/online giving. It was suggested that Briana's (Coffee Truck) rent be pro-rated this month because of Spring Break absences.

Ashley made a motion to approve the Minutes, Sheri seconded the motion, and the Council members present approved the motion.

Sheri gave the Financial Report through February 2024. Medora gave the Treasurer's Report as of February 25, 2024. The Profit & Loss reports showed the new format separating general operations activities & investment activities.

Pastor David submitted his report. He presented each of the Confirmands with a nice study Bible with their names printed on them at the beginning of their 'training'. Pastor is an Assistant Spiritual Director on the upcoming Men's Emmaus Walk, May 16^{th} - 19^{th} , taking place at Wellsprings in Blanco. Pastor also requested his last week of vacation to be April 9^{th} – 15^{th} . It was decided that because of the eclipse, the church office will be closed Monday, April 8^{th} . When considering attendance growth, are we benefitting by having 1^{st} Sunday breakfast and Lenten dinner meals before the Worship services? Comments were shared, but no conclusions were made.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

<u>Youth and Education</u> – Ashley reported that Alexis is working on the VBS sign-ups. Student Scholarship Applications are available. The Scholarship Committee consists of Ron Bigler, Charles Riley, Karla Riley, Arlene Hamlin, and possibly Kevin Hawkins. The middle age group Sunday School is finishing up their pizza series and will be celebrating with pizza next Sunday. They are starting a farm series next. Baseball season starts April 6, and Pastor David will be leading the prayer for the opening ceremony. Trinity sponsors two teams. Ashley coaches a t-ball team, and the Hesskews coach a softball team. The Youth will be handing out eclipse glasses with Trinity's logo & slogan during the parking lot space rental on April 8.

<u>Stewardship</u> – Sally handed out a list of all the Thank you Notes and Letters she has received. She also composed a letter she will be sending out to each of our Benevolence recipients encouraging them and expressing TLC's notation of their importance.

<u>Evangelism</u> – Karen W. will be Trinity's contact at Sam's Club. A new Christmas tree needs to be purchased before next year. Ease in moving around the Sanctuary was addressed. Karen W suggested that while pews are being moved for the carpet replacement, they be repositioned to provide better space between the narthex folding doors and the pew end. The Communion tables up front is also causing a crowded situation.

Worship – No report was submitted.

<u>Property</u> – Norman submitted his report. The irrigation system is turned off until further notice. Maintenance issues are going very smoothly. The major projects now include painting the fellowship hall and kitchen. Norm is taking quotes, and he has selected colors. The painting project will hopefully start after Confirmation Sunday, April 7th. Part of the project involves taking off all the crosses on the walls. Council decided to limit displaying crosses on one wall only. These crosses would be memorials of Trinity families. Other plaques, etc. from the Fellowship Hall would be hung on the walls in the hall area. Another major project is replacing the carpet in the Sanctuary. Hoffman Floor will do the job. Worship might need to be in the Fellowship Hall during this time. And the auxiliary parking lot lighting is the third major project. Norm is working with Verde Electric Co. Compliance with the City of Blanco Coding and the Blanco Dark Sky Guidelines must also be met.

Ashley made a motion to accept the Committee reports, Hal seconded the motion, and the Council members approved the motion.

Old Business -

-The Communion Assistants Schedule was updated through May, with Hal serving on May 12, Jerry on May 19, and Ashley on May 26

New Business -

Holy Week schedule was discussed. On Palm Sunday the Youth will provide a Pancake Breakfast. Maundy Thursday evening service would be held at 6:00pm, and Good Friday evening service would also be held at 6:00pm.

Possible Benevolence support opportunities for Estonia Lutheran Church (Rev. Haamer) will be printed in three Sunday bulletins: Palm Sunday, Easter Sunday, and Confirmation Sunday. The response has already been very encouraging. Our goal is \$10,000. We will finalize our contribution at the April 10th Council meeting. (See below) Jerry read another possible donation opportunity to help with the Panhandle Wildfire disaster through an organization called Mercy Chefs from Alabama, which provides food for the victims. Norman made a motion to send Mercy Chefs \$700.00, Ashley seconded the motion, and the Council members approved the motion.

Upcoming events include showing Season 4 of The Chosen beginning at Trinity on Thursday, May 9th. Men's Group is meeting Tuesday, March 19th at Hal's house with Hal & Wayne Gosnell hosting. CoApt Wellness Fair will be held April 16th, from 4-6. Trinity men will again provide hot dogs & chips. The Men's Group meeting should be April 16th but will be on April 17th instead. Llano Baumgartner will host it. The 1st Sunday breakfast at Trinity will be Sunday, April 7th, hosted by the men of Trinity. The next Blanco Ministerial Alliance breakfast will be at Trinity on Saturday, April 13th, and Pastor David will be responsible for finding the speaker, since he will be on vacation. Concerning two complaints about our church chimes, Council decided to ignore the complaints. Hal made the motion, Ashley seconded the motion, and the Council members approved the motion.

Ashley made a motion to adjourn the meeting, Sheri seconded the motion, and the Council members approved the motion. The meeting was adjourned at 8:15pm with everyone reciting The Lord's Prayer.

Home of Hope, Estonia Lutheran Mission Special Offerings Through May

We Are Family

See what great love the Father has given us that we should be called God's children—and we are!– 1John 3:1

I have recently been thinking about how rich the image of family is as a metaphor for the church. Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ is an association of congregations and "family" is a great word to describe who we are together and how we relate to one another. We have unity in a common confession of faith and a mission to make new disciples of Jesus in the world. Yet we also celebrate our freedom in Christ that leads to diverse expressions of worship and ministry as each family member lives out their faith differently as each is uniquely called and positioned in the Kingdom of God.

As family we connect, communicate, care for one another, forgive one another, share in each other's joys and sorrows, help one another in times of need, hold one another accountable, offer and receive advice and counsel and respect that each family member is ultimately responsible for themselves and their own decisions. Not only is this a good and helpful understanding for our association, but also for the individual members of a local congregation. The brothers and sisters of Christ gathered in a local church are called into a family relationship. When we are attentive to our church family and live into these relationships well, not only are we blessed by the relationship, but we bear witness to God's love to the world, too!

All too often the world sees Christians and the church as unkind, unwelcoming, judgmental, and primarily interested in controlling behaviors according to what the world sees as an antiquated moral code. Unfortunately, some of this reputation is warranted. We probably all are familiar with people and churches that reflect this reality. Yet God's desire for the church is to be the family of God and to lovingly relate to one another in ways that reflect the heart of Christ. If Christians do not love one another, forgive one another, enjoy one another or care for one another, then what does that say about us to the world?

God calls us to be family. We are united in our identity as children of God and co-heirs with Christ. In God's Spirit we are to love one another as Christ loves us, truly caring for one another. As you greet one another, meet with one another, worship and serve with one another, remember that we are family. It will change the way you see and relate to the people you attend church with. And the world will take notice, too. To quote an unbeliever's observation of the early church: "Behold! How they love one another."
