### Sticky Church

### Does the church have a back door? Yes.

The front door is when people come to join us in worship, activities or maybe even membership. The back door is when people slip away because of an issue or because they have not developed or been brought into meaningful relationships. Their connections with people in our church are just not strong enough to help them or keep them or inspire them. Does this happen at Trinity? Yes. It happens in most churches. What can we do about it?

We can make our church stickier. We can do something to make our congregation more of a fellowship of faith where we are in relationship in a small group, where we build our faith together, where we are doing life and are in mission together.

Pastor Larry Osborne writes in his book, **Sticky Church**, about how they have organized their congregations around small "Growth Groups" and it has made their churches very sticky. It is not a program of their church, it is how they do church.

### Here are five key principles:

**1. Closing the Back Door**: Pastor Osborne stresses the importance of retention over attraction. Instead of focusing solely on getting new members through the front door, churches should work to "close the back door" by keeping current members engaged and connected.

**2. The Power of Sermon-Based Small Groups**: Osborne advocates for small groups that dive deeper into the weekly sermon. These groups reinforce the message, encourage discussion, and provide practical applications of the sermon in everyday life. It is not simply a regurgitation of the preacher's sermon.

**3. Leadership Development through Small Groups**: He encourages building leadership from within by using small groups to identify and mentor potential leaders. This decentralized model allows for more organic leadership growth.

**4.** Authentic Community: Osborne stresses the importance of creating genuine relationships. People tend to stay where they feel connected and cared for. Small groups provide an environment where people can form deeper, personal connections.

**5. Simplicity and Focus**: Instead of offering numerous programs and ministries, Osborne encourages churches to focus on a few things that they can do well, like sermon-based small groups, to prevent burnout and to make church life less complicated.

This makes good sense to me. I have seen too many either not connect for lack of meaningful relationships or who have left for the same reason. Some people can't join one more thing. But others are still looking for a good place to connect.

What I'm looking for is a person who is organized and likes to coordinate to help me.

I'm also looking for people who feel called to host a group and others who will facilitate the discussions and interactions. Experts are welcome but not needed. There will be training.

## Life Thoughts: I LOVE JESUS AND.....

Jim and I recently spent ten days with our daughter and her family in upstate New York on one of our semiannual mom-dad-grandpa-grandma visits. As you might expect, our granddaughters, Ella, seven, and Hannah, four-and-a-half, are, as the saying goes, "the light of our lives." But there is another light in our lives that we cherish above all other lights---our Lord Jesus. This is the light that brings *Life* to all mankind.

Our Lutherans For Life Conference and Life Sunday 2025 theme this year is "Life Shines in Darkness," based on John 1:4-5, "In him was life, and the life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." Jesus is indeed *the* Light and *the* Life for the whole world.

As members of the body of Christ, we are called, or perhaps, more accurately, commanded, to live by this light and to let our light shine in the darkness, thus bringing glory to our Father in heaven. We are to let our *Life*, our actions, shine in the darkness as well.

"Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven." Matthew 5: 15-16

Related to being a light and living a life in Christ is the command to "Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old, he will not depart from it." Proverbs 22:6 And again we read in Psalm 78:5-7, " [God] appointed a law in Israel, which he commanded our fathers to teach to their children, that the next generation might know them, the children yet unborn, and arise and tell them to their children, so that they should set their hope in God and not forget the works of God, but keep his commandments."

We who truly love our Lord endeavor to do just that, trusting in God to keep His promise to us that He will bless His children to a thousand generations to those who fear and love Him. We often do not see the results of our teachings. We may not fully know how our life and our light--gifts from our Savior, shining in the dark world--have impacted those around us. But, *sometimes* God richly blesses us by showing us the fruits of our labors done in His name.

I celebrated my 75th birthday in September, and Ella waited for our visit to give me her hand-crafted birthday card. It is one of the most meaningful, beautiful cards I have ever received—and I have received a *lot* of birthday cards. The outside is wonderful, and the drawings of Ella and me warmed my heart.

But the inside of the card caught be totally by surprise and blasted into my heart like a ray of sunshine.

Ella's card lists the two things that *she sees* that her grandma loves best...Jesus and birds (in that order!) Words cannot begin to express the incredible joy that brings into my heart.

### "I have no greater joy than to hear that my children are walking in the truth." 3 John 4

My prayer for *all of us* in the body of Christ is that in the days ahead, we may continue to teach our children, grandchildren, friends, and neighbors, of all ages, about the Jesus we know and love. May everyone who sees us see the *light* of Jesus shining in our lives. May they see His *life* shining in us as well.

I pray that those who see each of us will say, "Barb loves Jesus and birds." "Jim loves Jesus and gardening." "\_\_\_\_\_ loves Jesus and \_\_\_\_\_." Just fill in the blanks and allow God to make *your* life a sharing and a shining of the Light and the Life of the world—our Lord Jesus.

Lord, Teach Us to Pray

Weeks of worry brought a woman to the surgery waiting room. Nagging symptoms in her husband's body grew to the point that not even manly denial could dismiss the feeling that something was not right. His wife, with womanly strength, bore the torch of hope -a hope that said, *"You're going to the doctor!"* He went. The prognosis was serious but hopeful, but surgery was required to understand what was truly going on. So, there we sat, she and I. We chatted about meaningless things, and then in words that were few, she talked about her worst-case fears. I am sure that somewhere in there we prayed. Then the Doctor came out. As compassionately as he could, and with words that plainly explained what he found, he shared that the situation was terminal and fast-acting. She was stunned into silence until at last, realizing that she needed to say something, quietly uttered a one-word expletive. In that word I clearly heard something that came from the depth of her soul. It wasn't offensive, but honest; not dirty, but pure; not profane, but prayer. It was the most authentic prayer I have ever heard next to Jesus praying, "My God, my God, why hast Thou forsaken me?"

The ancient teachers of Christian faith have taught us that two situations teach us to pray authentically, that is, from the heart. One is the experience of being awed at the magnificence of something astoundingly beautiful. The individual experiences a kind of emptying, and rises in heart-felt worship for that which one has now experienced. And when experienced, the experience longs to be shared. The other situation is in great suffering. Here, too, there is an emptying, but in anguish. The mind fails for words, but the heart speaks its own prayer in a language known and heard by the Spirit of truth. Here too. where there is an emptying there is a great filling, a filling of grace. The woman above uttered a one-word prayer. She was filled with a grace that bore her husband's suffering and eventual death. She was, by grace, the incarnation of God's love, and was herself healed by her faith.

So there you have it. Emptying and filling, dying and rising. One is in the presence of overwhelming beauty, the other in the presence of overwhelming suffering. Yet both result in worship and the experience of the Love that surpasses all understanding. Both are sacred. Both are missional. Both situations demand that you be present to that which is right there before you. Both demand that you pay the price. Both result in divine love flowing like a torrential river for your neighbor. Are you willing to rejoice for the love God has for your neighbor? Are you strong enough to be weak in tears and steadfast in compassion? Do you really want the Lord to teach you to pray? You may find He is teaching you to love. You may find He is teaching you to live. You will certainly find that you are not the object of your prayer, but its fulfillment, by grace, to His glory, as it was for the disciples of old.

### COUNCIL NOTES—from the September 11, 2024 Meeting

President Jerry Gass called the meeting to order at 6:02pm. Council members in attendance were Norman Eubank, Jerry Gass, Pastor David Mayer, Keith Morgenroth, Sheri Riley, Karen Steiger, and Hal Switzer. In remembrance of the 9/11 tragedy, Pastor David's devotional challenged us to know the difference between *being marked* by an experience and *being defined* by that experience in how we react. Jesus was *marked by* the Cross, but *defined by* the joy of His obedience to His Father knowing that He was doing this out of love for His Father and for us... that we might believe. Referenced John 3:16.

There were no corrections to the Minutes of the August 14<sup>th</sup> Council meeting. The <u>Action Items</u> were discussed. Jerry announced that Travis had secured January 6, 2025, as our BISD Teacher Appreciation Luncheon date. Keith made a motion to accept the Minutes, Sheri seconded the motion, and the Council members approved the motion. Sheri gave the Financial Report through August 2024. Keith gave the Treasurer's Report as of August 31, 2024.

Pastor submitted his report for September 2024. Jay Slaughter and Casey Brones have requested membership at Trinity, and Pastor Beverly Tye is interested in becoming an associate member of Trinity; thereby, retaining her retired pastor affiliation with the Methodist Church. Sheri made the motion to accept these 3 people as members/associate member of Trinity, Norman seconded the motion, and the Council members approved the motion. Pastor David announced that the Harvest Workers Bible study will resume on Monday, September 16<sup>th</sup>, now covering the Old Testament with Pastor John Waak. The Thursday morning Bible study continues with I & 2 Peter. Nine people have been trained to administer Holy Communion. The Rocky Road Band will lead the worship music on Sunday, September 22<sup>nd</sup>. And the Blanco Ecumenical Men's Breakfast will be hosted by St. Ferdinand's Catholic Church this Saturday, September 14<sup>th</sup>. Pastor David gave each Council member a book entitled <u>Sticky Church</u> by Larry Osborne… how to develop a small group ministry to keep people from leaving out of the back door for the wrong reasons.

### Committee Reports:

Youth and Education – No report was submitted.

Stewardship – No report was submitted.

Evangelism – No report was submitted.

<u>Worship</u> – In Travis' absence, Pastor David reported that Janice would like more training on the organ. Leta will begin choir practice again soon. She hopes to sing for Veteran's Sunday, Reformation Sunday, and work on something special for Christmas.

<u>Property</u> – Norman submitted his report. Concerning the auxiliary parking lot lighting project, Norman discussed 3 options. Council agreed to go with Option 3). Trinity would purchase a pole mounted light to be installed on the existing meter pole left by the coffee truck with a timer & on/off switch. Later purchase & install 4 wall pack lights. Norman did a quick review of several Capital improvements he would like to do in 2025.

Norman made a motion to accept the Committee Reports, Keith seconded the motion, and the Council members approved the motion.

### Old Business -

--The Communion Assistants Schedule was updated as follows: Nov 3 (All Saint's Sunday) Sheri Riley; Nov 10 – Jerry Gass; and Nov 24 – Keith Morgenroth

--The Polka Worship service was discussed, and it was decided to bring it before the congregation as to whether we should continue scheduling this service in future years.

--Pastor announced that he will begin seeking additional participants in a more contemporary music venue to start small perhaps during Sunday School later this Fall. He will be at the Annual LCMC Gathering & Convention Sept 29-Oct 2 in Marion, Iowa. He will visit with his brother in Des Moines earlier, so he will leave on Sept 26<sup>th</sup>. And he will find a replacement preacher for Sunday, Sept 29<sup>th</sup>.

--The Church Council Retreat will be held Saturday, Oct 19<sup>th</sup> in the Fellowship Hall from 9:00am to Noon. Be familiar with the 2 books, and have lunch brought in.

--Hal has chosen the Nominating Committee consisting of Rocky Chisholm, Sharon Cox, and Hal Switzer. The Budget Committee will consist of Rocky Chisholm, Connie Cox, Keith Morgenroth, and Hal Switzer.

### New Business -

--The contents of the November 10<sup>th</sup> Congregational Meeting were discussed. The election of President, Secretary, and Worship will take place. Copies of TLC's Constitution were handed out and changes to be proposed were highlighted in red.

--Annual reports by Council members should be turned in by the end of the year, so they can be included in the January 2025 Congregational Meeting packet.

--Hal handed out a Proposed Budget for 2025. Council members are to review the Budget and submit comments, etc. on or before the November Council meeting.

Pastor David brought up for consideration possibly providing financial assistance to smaller struggling sister congregations like Patrick Welton's congregation since TLC is very financially stable at this point. Pastor Patrick was receptive to the idea.

Sheri made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Keith seconded the motion, and the Council members approved the motion. The meeting was adjourned at 8:28pm with everyone reciting The Lord's Prayer.
