I believe you and I will have a clearer understanding of Luke and his presentation of the life and ministry of our Lord Jesus.

## **Cheering on a Comeback**

Like most sports fans, I love a good comeback! There's nothing quite like when a team mounts a comeback after falling hopelessly behind. It is thrilling to experience how the players, coaches, and fans rally to support one another and celebrate each step along the way just to get back into a position to potentially be victorious!

Recently, my wife and I came back: After a six-month absence from the church we attend when in town, we were finally able to come back to worship on a Sunday morning this month. Life and ministry commitments had us on the road since Easter and we truly missed the church that had become family to us. But the comeback we experienced was not personally thrilling for me. Instead, I sheepishly walked through those doors, wondering what people were thinking of us after all this time. I even found myself saying "the prodigals have returned" to one of my friends.

As I began to process it, my experience really bothered me. Why did I feel this way? No one was judgmental at all. Not one person asked, "where have you been?" Many greeted us with joyous expressions of welcome. So why did I, a minister of the Gospel who should definitely know better, feel such guilt and shame? And if I had this intense struggle, for how many others might similar feelings be an obstacle to coming back to church?

As we approach Advent and Christmas, we are more likely to encounter people who may not be in the pattern of attending church regularly. Many may be struggling with intense feelings of guilt and shame even thinking about returning to worship. Some of these feelings may get projected onto other church members, like my thinking we would be judged or looked down on. Other feelings might be more of an internal spiritual battle. Regardless, it is mission-critical for the church to cheer on the comeback.

If you haven't been active in church lately, I want my experience to be an encouragement for you. While the devil will use every trick he can to keep you away from the life-giving experience of a faith community gathered around word and sacrament, trust that God desires your presence and participation. I am confident that you will encounter a loving, welcoming reception by your church family who will celebrate your presence.

If you are a regular worshipper, please enthusiastically support and encourage any and all comebacks! Begin to pray daily for the Holy Spirit to gather those whom the Lord calls to come back to worship. Pray for God to bring to mind specific people to pray for and encourage. Perhaps God is leading you to reach out to someone. Be mindful to not inadvertently contribute to any feelings of guilt or shame. Instead, take an interest in them out of genuine love. Offer to meet for coffee or lunch. Find out what's going on in their lives and how you can pray for them. Consider inviting them to a special event, small group, or service project that gives the opportunity for casual, relational connection. And most importantly, when you see someone new or that you haven't seen for some time, warmly welcome them and simply let them know you are so happy to see them. These simple actions can make a difference as we cheer on a comeback!

#### Notes from the Church Council Meeting on October 9, 2024

Vice-President Hal Switzer called the meeting to order at 5:58pm. Council members in attendance were Norman Eubank, Ashley Finch, Travis Kersten, Pastor David Mayer, Keith Morgenroth, Sheri Riley, Karen Steiger, Hal Switzer, and Karen Wagner. Pastor Dave read Psalm 100 and Psalm 103 and based his opening prayer on the attributes of God...good, wonderful, gracious, kind, and powerful Lord. May He guide us in His wisdom as we make decisions as a Council.

There were no corrections to the Minutes of the September 11<sup>th</sup> Council meeting. Travis made a motion to accept the Minutes, Keith seconded the motion, and the Council members approved the motion. The <u>Action Items</u> were discussed and had been done.

Sheri gave the Financial Report through September 2024. Keith gave the Treasurer's Report as of September 30, 2024.

Pastor Dave submitted his report for October 2024. He has 3 students in the First-Communion Class... Steele Finch, Adley Mann, and Eric Meyerton. They and their families will be given Holy Communion before the rest of the Congregation is invited to the front on either of the two Communion Sundays in October. The two books to be referenced at the October 19<sup>th</sup> Council Retreat were briefly discussed. Pastor also reported on the LCMC Annual Gathering that he attended in Iowa.

#### COMMITTEE REPORTS:

<u>Youth and Education</u> – Ashley reported that the Youth Spaghetti Dinner & Bingo fundraiser was a great success, raising over \$2,600. The Girls' Retreat is this coming weekend in Kendalia. The mid age youth group Sunday School is beginning a beach themed study for 5 weeks. Trinity will sponsor '5<sup>th</sup> Quarter' after the football game on October 18<sup>th</sup>.

#### Stewardship – No report was submitted.

<u>Evangelism</u> – Karen W reported that she had spoken to Sally, and Sally will revisit making the banner to be put on Seymour's Garage's US281 fence. A possible project next year might be decorating the church courtyard fence for Homecoming Weekend.

<u>Worship</u> – Travis reported that Leta wants to start choir practice this week. Sheila (Media room) wants to stay on task with sound testing for special microphones and easier/better accessibility to Facebook. Council agreed to purchase several potted Mums to have on reserve when no altar flowers are provided.

<u>Property</u> – Norman submitted his report. The bi-annual A/C inspection was just completed. Norman replaced all air filters. All is good.

Travis made a motion to accept the Committee Reports, Sheri seconded the motion, and the Council members approved the motion.

#### Old Business -

No updates were made to the Communion Assistants Schedule. Hal reported that the Electronic Giving opportunity is working. Pastor said that instructions for using this option for giving will be in future bulletins. Travis has agreed to make bar-b-que for the Teachers' Appreciation Luncheon on January 6, 2025. He and a team will coordinate all the other needs. Elementary teachers & Central Office personnel will be served from 11:30am – 12:15pm. Middle School & High School teachers will be served from 12:15pm – 1:00pm.

The Nominating Committee has had no other names submitted for the positions of Council members whose 3-year terms are expiring. Hal submitted a proposed Budget for 2025, which was briefly discussed. The Congregation will elect the officers and approve the 2025 constitutional changes at the Congregational Meeting on November 10<sup>th</sup>. The Budget will be available to the congregation for review starting Sunday, November 17<sup>th</sup>.

Changes and updates to the Proposed Church Constitution were discussed. Refer to the Proposed Updates for 2024 Constitution handout. Proposed changes are printed in red. Norman made a motion to accept the changes and updates to the proposed Constitution & Bylaws as presented and discussed, Travis seconded the motion, and the Council members approved the motion. The Congregation will approve the Updated Constitution & Bylaws at the November 10, 2024, Congregational Meeting.

#### New Business -

The 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter Benevolence spreadsheet was presented and discussed. Changes for the next quarter were also suggested because of changes that are affecting 3 of our recipients. Travis made a motion to decrease next quarter's amount for FCA by \$200. and increase the amounts for LCMC National and LCMC Texas by \$100. each. Norman seconded the motion, and the Council members approved the motion.

Sheri made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Travis seconded the motion, and the Council members approved the motion. The meeting was adjourned at 7:54pm with everyone reciting The Lord's Prayer.

<u>ANNUAL REPORTS FOR 2024 DUE BY DECEMBER 31<sup>st</sup></u> According to Trinity's constitution, "All committees, ministries, and organizations within the Congregation shall submit reports to the church office at least twenty-one (21) days prior to the Annual January Business Meeting.
