COUNCIL NOTES—from the November 12, 2025 Meeting

President Jerry Gass called the meeting to order at 6:05pm. Council members present were Sally Anderson, Norman Eubank, Ashley Finch, Jerry Gass, Wayne Gosnell, Pastor David Mayer, Keith Morgenroth, Sheri Riley, Karen Steiger, and Karen Wagner.

Pastor David's devotional centered around the definitions of ***fanatical* vs *radical*** as explained in the Anglican theologian, John Stott's, book Radical Disciple. Rather than be *fanatic*... exaggerating half-truths, we are encouraged to be *radical*... 100% committed to the whole truth; specifically in our commitment to following Jesus and His teachings. May we intentionally seek The Holy Spirit's guidance as we make decisions on behalf of Trinity Lutheran Church.

The Minutes of the October 15th Council meeting were corrected. Keith made a motion to accept the Minutes as corrected and amended, Karen W seconded the motion, and the Council members approved the motion. The Action Items were discussed. The QR Code has been added to Trinity's ad in The Chamber Blast and in the bulletin. It will also be added to the BCN ad. Wayne reported on his informal study of relating weekly attendance to weekly giving. Interestingly, there is a direct relationship, but even better is seeing that giving continues even when attendance fluctuates.

Sheri gave the Financial Report through October 2025. Keith gave the Treasurer's Report as of October 31, 2025. He presented a new, more concise summary of comparisons of this year with last year, by month & year-to-date, actual and budgeted.

Pastor David submitted his report. He recommended that Blake & Manon Schanhals and their children, Gus & Lillian, be considered for membership. Keith made a motion to accept them into membership, Sheri seconded the motion, and the Council members approved the motion. Pastor announced that Ray Wolbrecht will be teaching on Intelligent Design Creation at the November CMOB Tuesday evening fellowship (Nov 18th). He also announced that Advent begins on Sunday, November 30th. The LCMC Texas District is promoting Giving Tuesday on December 2nd...for every \$ given to LCMC, they would match a \$, up to \$12,000. Norman made a motion that Trinity participate in Giving Tuesday, Wayne seconded the motion, and the Council members approved the motion.

After reviewing the attendance chart in Pastor's report, it was suggested to show an Average Attendance for both services, as well as a Total Attendance Average.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Youth and Education – Ashley announced that the Youth's Fall Festival was a huge success, and after all expenses were paid a profit of \$4,400 was realized. It was decided to do it again next year. The Great Food Race will be held next Sunday, November 16th. The food collection will benefit the Student Pantry at Good Samaritan. The Angel Tree project is starting next Sunday for 31 kids. The gifts will be due on Sunday, December 14th, and we will wrap them the following Sunday, December 21st. Ashley reported that chartering a bus for Youth Camp will cost \$3,500 more than renting vans. A company anonymously donated that difference. The Camp will cost \$403 per student, but students can reduce that amount by participating in activities throughout the year. Camp is also open to non-member students. The Girls' Retreat is scheduled as a Lock-In on December 6-7. They would eat in Boerne, do a pottery activity, and go through the drive-thru lights. Sunday morning the girls will provide food for the fellowship after the early Service.

Stewardship – Wayne is going to give a Stewardship Temple Talk Sunday, November 16th about Trinity's benevolence distributions by organizations, specially giving an update on Alfredo & Anita with Wycliffe Bible Translators. He will also review our Stewardship Program: The Tithing Covenant and The Legacy Giving Covenant.

Evangelism – Sally has been working on an easy-to-use QR code. She has also been designing a nice Thank You Note for all those businesses that donated to the Fall Festival Fundraiser. The outside church sign design is next on her agenda. Wayne suggested working on a plan to reach the neighborhood, specifically the 7 new houses that are planned for the lot diagonally across from the church. Ashley also suggested that the Youth might bless, pray, and post Scripture as these new houses are being built/finished.

Fellowship – Karen W reported that Trinity will supply the desserts for the Community Thanksgiving Dinner on Sunday, November 23rd at 6:00pm at the Methodist Church. She also reminded us of Trinity's 5th Sunday Potluck Brunch on November 30th between the two Services (no Sunday School).

Worship – No report was given. Wayne did announce that Arlene Hamlin & Cymbre Wicker will do the reminder notices for Greeter sign-ups before each Sunday.

Property – Norman submitted his report. The HVAC semi-annual inspection was completed & filters were replaced. There was an additional drain line added to the drain pans above the kitchen to correct the overflow problem, which was covered by our warranty. An electrical issue led to realizing that the electrical panel in the hall closet is outdated and Blanco A/C & Electrical will give them an analysis of what is needed to bring it up to code. Norman reported that the media door project was completed. The Stained-Glass Window project needs further discussion. New identification & directional signs have been placed all over the Church property.

The Council members acknowledged that the reports were given and accepted.

Old Business

- Wayne presented a whole list of Appreciation Letters.

Prayers continue for improvements to our Contemporary Service... increased attendance... engaged participation... live musicians... more sophisticated use of our organ, including coordinated media slides.

The Annual Congregational Meeting will be held Sunday, November 16th to elect the four Council Positions that are expiring this year... Youth, Stewardship, Evangelism, and Fellowship.

No updates on the Budget preparations for 2026. Council members were encouraged to review their individual budgets and give necessary feedback to help with next year's budget.

New Business

- Barb Geistfeld has requested funds for Trinity to purchase Bible story books to be used by Trinity's Life Team. Council authorized funds up to \$200.00 to purchase these books. These funds would be taken from Pastor David's Professional Expenses. Council members also approved the Blanco County Interagency Council's request to meet at Trinity 3 times in 2026...Tuesday, March 10th, July 7th, and November 10th from 2pm-4pm. Keith made the motion to accept the request, Norman seconded the request, and the Council members approved the request.

Keith announced that The Audit Committee this year-end would be Stan Steiger, Roland Pfeiffer, and Keith.

The entry combination will be changed after January 1st.

The Holiday Schedule will be as follows: The Church Office will be closed from December 25th –January 1st.

Sheri made a motion to adjourn the meeting, Keith seconded the motion, and the Council members approved the motion. The meeting was adjourned at 8:50pm with everyone reciting The Lord's Prayer.

Celebrate Jesus

Amid the twinkling lights and festive cheer, it's easy to forget why we celebrate Christmas. We can get caught up in the hustle and bustle of it all: parties and programs, gift buying and cookie baking, travel planning and family gatherings. All the activity of the season can crowd out the real meaning and purpose for the holiday itself. While we may say "Jesus is the reason for the season," what does that really mean for us today? What if an often overlooked Bible story can help us reconnect our celebrations to the true gift of Christmas?

One cold December Sunday when I was in the first grade, I got to read my very first verse with my own eyes out of a real Bible. I still remember it to this day. In Sunday School, we studied a part of the Christmas story that is rarely talked about. The lesson came from Luke 2 and was about Simeon meeting the baby Jesus in the temple. Simeon was a righteous and faithful man who had been waiting for God to send the Messiah to bring salvation to Israel and hope for the world. In fact, the Lord had promised Simeon that he would not die before seeing the Messiah.

We read aloud Luke 2:29-32: "*Simeon took him up in his arms, praised God, and said, 'Now, Master, you can dismiss your servant in peace, as you promised. For my eyes have seen your salvation. You have prepared it in the presence of all peoples—a light for revelation to the Gentiles and glory to your people Israel.'*" And just like that, my eyes were opened to see Jesus as the true gift of Christmas. Here Simeon sees and responds joyously and faithfully to God's grace in giving Jesus to the world. Can't you just picture the joy Simeon must have experienced as he lifted baby Jesus, praising God and delighting in his goodness and mercy?!

Then as Luke 2 continues, we are introduced to Anna, an elderly widow who had dedicated her life to serving the Lord in the temple, to prayer and to fasting. She, too, met baby Jesus that day and began praising God and telling everyone that he was the Messiah, the long-awaited anointed one who had come into this world to bring salvation.

I love the story of Simeon and Anna as it reminds us what Christmas is really about. The world is in desperate need of Jesus, the Messiah. Like Simeon and Anna, we are invited to recognize and rejoice with a deeper appreciation for the gift that Jesus is to the whole world. We rejoice and celebrate this season full of hope and gratitude. Our faithful response in celebrating Jesus' birth should be like theirs: gleefully praising God and telling others what this means not only for us, but for everyone who calls on His name.

This Christmas, pause and ask: How can my celebrations better reflect the joy of meeting Jesus, the promised Messiah and savior of the world? May our response give glory, honor and thanks to God. And let us share the Good News with a lost and broken world desperately in need of all that Jesus came to give. JESUS IS THE REASON FOR THE SEASON. So let's celebrate Jesus!
